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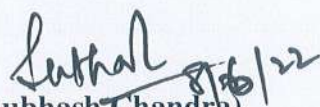

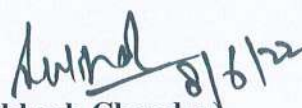

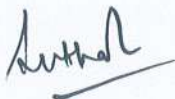
**Minutes of the 17<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the Executive Committee of the National Authority.**

**Venue:** Krishna Conference Room through Hybrid Mode (Personal Attendance and Video conferencing)

**Date & Time:** 1<sup>st</sup> of June 2022 at 10.00 AM.

**The list of members and other participants who attended the meeting is attached at Annexure-A.**

1. The meeting of the Executive Committee (EC) of the National Authority was held on 1<sup>st</sup> of June 2022 under the chairmanship of Director General of Forests & Special Secretary (DGF&SS), MoEF&CC and Chairperson Executive Committee of National Authority. Shri Subhash Chandra, Chief Executive Officer (CEO), National Authority welcomed the DGF &SS and Chairman and all other members of Executive Committee and the officers present in the meeting. The CEO National Authority welcomed and introduced Shri Pravir Pandey, Additional Secretary & Financial Advisor AS&FA who has joined recently in the Ministry attending his first meeting of the Executive Committee.
2. CEO, National Authority with the permission of Chair briefly explained the role of Executive Authority and AS&FA in Ministry as well as in CAMPA. CEO also briefed about the status of activities undertaken under CAF Act, 2016.
3. With the permission of Chairperson, Joint CEO National Authority briefly explained the action taken on the decision of 16<sup>th</sup> Executive Committee and the agenda items of the 17<sup>th</sup> meeting. Thereafter, agenda items of the Executive Committee were taken up for detailed discussion.
4. **Agenda item No 1. Confirmation of Minutes of the 16<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the EC of the National Authority:** The Executive Committee confirmed the minutes of 16<sup>th</sup> meeting of EC held on 10<sup>th</sup> of March 2022 at 11.00 AM, 15<sup>th</sup> of March, 2022.
5. **Agenda Item no. 2: Action Taken Report on 16<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the EC:**  
The action taken report on the decision of the 16<sup>th</sup> meeting of the EC of the National Authority was perused and noted.
6. AS&FA at the outset informed about new financial regulations for CSS and advised States to comply with them. He also sought information about utilization of funds



released under CSS. In case 75% funds allocated during last year have not been spent/ utilized, no further release will be made.

**PART-A GENERAL DECISIONS/ OBSERVATIONS OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE:**

7. The Executive Committee deliberated on the common issues and concerns of CAMPA especially priority activities requiring more focused approach for which funds are to be utilized on priority and effective monitoring of CAMPA activities along with outcome/ impact-based evaluation. The EC discussed the following and directed PCCF & HoFF and CEO of all States & UTs and that these should be scrupulously followed by the States/UTs.
- i. DGF&SS stressed the need for effective **Internal** and **Third-Party Monitoring** of CAMPA activities and urged PCCFs to ensure that all data on CA plantation and other CAMPA activities must be correctly uploaded on e-Green Watch Portal. Further, the records on CAMPA activities should be maintained in prescribed format in the relevant registers. He mentioned that Ministry is working to upgrade the portal for addressing issues raised by some States/UTs. Meanwhile States/ UTs should ensure correctness of KML files and data on afforestation and other CAMPA activities.
  - ii. DGF&SS emphasized that activities under NPV especially plantations/ assisted Natural Regeneration should be undertaken as per approved Working Plan prescriptions.
  - iii. CEO, National authority invited attention of all States/ UTs that while proposing various activities from the interest part under CAF Rule 6, first provision of enhanced costs of afforestation must be provided. Whenever mandatory (afforestation) activities are carried out after substantial gap of time, then they might need additional funds than monies realized against CA. In such cases additional requirements of fund are to be met from interest accrued on already realized monies deposited in Public Account of Funds/ banks of the State concerned. In future the amount received for the particular CA proposed and the amount that will be utilized for raising this CA should be specified.
  - iv. AS&FA also specifically mentioned the rule position. The rule 6(a) of CAF Rules, 10<sup>th</sup> August, 2018 is quoted below: –

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*The interest occurred on monies in the State Fund not less than 60 per cent of the interest transferred to the State Fund and further accrued on the amount available in the State fund referred to in the sub-rule (1) shall be spent on activities for the purpose of conservation at the increased wage rates;*

- a. *To offset the incremental cost of Compensatory Afforestation and penal Compensatory Afforestation at the increased wage rates;*
- b. *To offset the incremental cost of catchment area treatment plan at the increased wage rates;*
- c. *To offset the incremental cost of wildlife management plan at the increased wage rates;.*
- v. The DGF &SS reemphasized the need for an integrated APO for CAMPA, CSS and State Fund. The activities must be part of Integrated Management Plans or perspective plans and clearly indicate how much funding support is available from CSSs of Ministry and other sources including State Funds to avoid duplication and ensuring dovetailing funds for greater effectiveness. He stressed upon the States/ UTs for making perspective plan for utilizing NPV funds for at least 5 years so that identified and discernible outcomes can be achieved and qualitative and quantitative improvement in forests and tree cover including enrichment of biodiversity is achieved.
- vi. CEO, National Authority It has been observed in many instances that funds sanctioned and approved by National Authority are not being released by many State Governments in a timely manner, which is adversely affecting implementation of Compensatory Afforestation and other CAMPA activities making it impossible to properly utilise the approved funds. The Executive Committee took a serious note of the matter and asked the National Authority to communicate to State Governments for the early resolution of the issue.
- vii. Soil and Moisture Conservation works should focus on rejuvenation of rivers and achievements should be placed as per the DPRs for 13 major rivers prepared by ICFRE and also States implementing Ganga River Rejuvenation under NMCG. North-Eastern States should also focus on afforestation and soil & moisture conservation activities for improving forest cover in river catchments for controlling floods. APOs in future should indicate the reference of DPRs being implemented.

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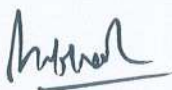


- viii. The State /UTs Authorities should make a detail record and status report of all the lands of protected areas/ forests under transmission lines and also natural regeneration and submit the status of their management to MoEF&CC.
- ix. The Chairperson reiterated States/ UTs to involve concerned IRO at the APO planning Stage and thereafter in monitoring of activities. Though, Head of IRO is a member of Steering Committee, but it is observed that the APOs are not shared with them in advance for better appraisal. In future, the APOs should be submitted to concerned IRO at least one week before the meeting of State Steering Committee.
- x. All IROs were asked to take necessary action for inspection of CAMPA activities carried out in last 3 years. States/ UTs were asked to provide progress report and monitoring reports of internal as well as third party monitoring to IRO concerned along with all necessary support to Head of IRO and their officers for carrying out field inspections of CAMPA activities. As IRO and FSI are important stakeholders in the monitoring process, every state should make suitable provisions for budgetary support to them under monitoring head.
- xi. DGF& SS directed IROs for submitting the suggestions/comments on the APOs of respective States/UTs examine the monitoring and evaluation reports of both internal and external reports of CAMPA works done.
- xii. DGF&SS directed State Forest Departments to complete the demarcation and digitization of forest boundaries for protection of forests and plantation activities within six months.
- xiii. CEO NA reiterated that as a principle at least 80 per cent of the CAMPA funds should be utilized for the purpose of afforestation and forest regeneration and only up to a maximum of 20% be used for essential infrastructure support and capacity building that has direct impact on extension and improvement of forest cover and wildlife habitat. Soil & moisture Conservation measures including creation of water bodies/ harvesting structures should be integrated with CA and ANR activities for holistic improvement of site quality.
- xiv. DGF & SS directed that construction and maintenance of Rescue Centre should only be taken up after vetting of Central Zoo Authority and if funds are not available from other sources. Further, NPV funds should be utilized systematically and judiciously in activities for restoring forest landscapes to improve quality of forest cover, enhance biodiversity, strengthen, and optimize hydrological and other ecosystem functions, soil and water conservation measures and improvement of wildlife habitat.

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- xv. CEO NA emphasised that all the records of CAMPA activities including amount sanctioned and expenditure incurred should be maintained scrupulously by concerned State CAMPA since its inception. The records should be properly maintained with Range, Division office and CEO State CAMPA in prescribed formats and placed on their websites.
- xvi. The annual accounts of CAMPA should be timely finalized and necessary action should be taken for early audit in time bound manner. Annual Reports are required to be laid in the Assembly, information on these the Annual reports laid in the Assembly may please be furnished to National Authority.
- xvii. Many States/UTs have requested to consider allowing purchase of vehicles for front-line field staff citing reasons of non-availability of hired vehicles in remote forest areas. PCCF of Goa mentioned that cost of hiring vehicle is very high and desired operational vehicles including 4 WD vehicles in rough terrain are not available on hiring. PCCF & HoFF, UT of J&K mentioned that the vehicles on hire are not available in J&K for remote forest areas. Though, the CAF Rules do not allow purchase of Staff Car purpose of which is different from the vehicles required for field staff for forestry operations. It was also pointed out by States & UTs that Motorcycles are not available on hiring and are required to be purchased for front-line staff for field duties. It is necessary to equip field officials with suitable vehicles for enabling them to carry out routine patrolling and forestry works including watch and ward for forest fire effectively. It was decided that States/ UTs requiring procurement of vehicles will submit requisite proposals with justification of purchase of Multiple Utility Vehicles for operational purposes. The proposals will be examined by National Authority for appropriate action.
- xviii. The Forest Departments of States/ UTs are carrying out removal of Lantana and other weeds which require huge funds. Considering the magnitude of the task of Lantana removal, the States/ UTs should find out more cost-effective ways and consider integrating removal of Lantana and other weeds with afforestation so that these sites are immediately taken up for artificial plantation/ regeneration. Therefore, it was decided that no new proposals for Lantana/ weeds removal will be taken up till a detailed study is undertaken about efficacy of current methodology. The success stories can be submitted by states and the officers of other states will be asked to physically see and access the results for adoption of best practices.





- xix. States/ UTs should maintain a website of the State CAMPA with all relevant data, information, plantation maps, kml files of other assets and photographs of various activities carried out under CAMPA. In respect of CA, plantations/ regeneration activities before and after photographs should be uploaded.
- xx. The kml files of all activities under CAMPA should be properly verified by the concerned Divisional Forest Officer and the certificates should be uploaded on the website.
- xxi. While submitting APOs, CEO State CAMPA concerned should certify that all estimates have been prepared on the basis of cost estimates followed for realizing CA, NPV and other levies from the User Agencies.
- xxii. The CEO, State/ UT CAMPA must certify that estimates for mandatory activities are based on provisions made in the CA funds received from the User Agency.

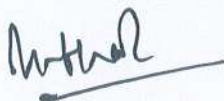
### **8. AGENDA ITEMS NO: 3 TO 9**

**Agenda Item No. 18:** The proposal for “Identification and Notification of 100 No. of Biodiversity Heritage Sites in Nagaland in 2021-22 and 2022-23”.

**Decision:** The proposal was discussed in detail and it was decided to seek comments from State CAMPA Authority and concerned IRO.

**Agenda Item No. 19:** Project Proposal for “Transitioning from shifting cultivation to Settled land use in the State of Nagaland” with a total outlay of Rs. 20.00 Crores - submitted by NAEB, MOEFCC.

**Decision:** The proposal was deliberated in detail. It was decided that a pilot project at a specific site should be taken up to assess the potential for scaling up of the project. The State Authority may consider sending a revised proposal for a Pilot Project.

**Agenda Item No. 3: Approval of Annual Plan of Operation (APO) 2022-23 UT Authority of Andaman & Nicobar Islands**

**(NA-15/22/2020-NA)**

**Decision:** Andaman Nicobar Islands (A&NI) State Authority has submitted the Annual Plan of Operation for the financial year 2022-23 to the National Authority having proposed outlay of **Rs.15.73 crore** only for the year 2022-23.

The Executive Committee of National Authority deliberated in detail and noted that as per information submitted by State Authority, they have backlog of 1954 ha of Compensatory Afforestation. So far, the UT's share of Rs 16.41 crore has been transferred. The EC approved mandatory CA and other plantation activities pending reconciliation and directed PCCF A&NI and DDG, IRO Chennai to reconcile pending CA and funds collected against diversion and confirm the details to NA. A&NI Authority may furnish the updated status for consideration of remaining parts of APO. The EC approved the APO of 2022-23 with financial outlay of **Rs.6.91 crore and** activities amounting to **Rs. 8.82 crore** deferred as per following component wise details:

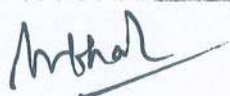

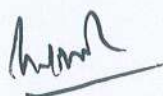
