Minutes of the 16th Meeting of the Executive Committee of the National Authority.

<u>Venue</u>: Krishna Conference Room through Hybrid Mode (Personal Attendance and Video conferencing)

Date & Time: 10th of March 2022 at 11.00 AM, 15th of March, 2022 at 3.00 PM and 6th of April 2022 at 12 noon.

The list of members and other participants who attended the meeting is attached at Annexure-A.

- 1. The meeting of the Executive Committee (EC) of the National Authority was held on 10th March, 15th March and 6th of April 2022 under the chairmanship of Director General of Forests & Special Secretary (DGF&SS), MoEF&CC and Chairperson Executive Committee of National Authority. The Chief Executive Officer, National Authority welcomed the DGF &SS and Chairman as well as all other members of Executive Committee and the officers present in the meeting.
- 2. CEO, National Authority with the permission of Chair introduced the agenda. Joint CEO National Authority briefly explained the action taken on the decision of 15th Executive Committee and the agenda items of the 16th meeting. Thereafter, agenda items of the Executive Committee were taken up for detailed discussion.
- Agenda item No 1. Confirmation of Minutes of the 15^h Meeting of the EC of the National Authority: The Executive Committee confirmed the minutes of 15th meeting of EC held on 20th October 2021.
- 4. Agenda Item no. 2: Action Taken Report on 15th Meeting of the EC:
 The action taken report on the decision of the 15th meeting of the EC of the National Authority was perused and noted. DGF&SS asked the CEO, National Authority to submit the reports as mentioned in Agenda 14 within next 30 days.

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PART-A GENERAL DECISIONS/ OBSERVATIONS OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE:

- 5. The Executive Committee deliberated on the common issues and concerns of CAMPA especially priority activities requiring more focussed approach for which fund has to be utilized and effective monitoring of CAMPA activities along with outcome/ impact-based evaluation. The EC discussed the following and directed PCCF & HoFF and CEO of all states that these should be scrupulously followed by the States/UTs.
- i. DGF&SS stressed the need for effective Internal and Third-Party Monitoring of CAMPA activities and urged PCCFs to ensure that all data on CA plantation and other CAMPA activities must be correctly uploaded on e-Green Watch Portal. Further, the records on CAMPA activities should be maintained in prescribed format in the relevant registers. He mentioned that Ministry is working to upgrade the portal for addressing issues raised by some States/UTs. Meanwhile States/ UTs should ensure correctness of KML files and data on afforestation and other CAMPA activities.
- ii. Chairperson raised the issue that the APOs of every State/ UT should include items on Forest Protection, Fire Control and Management, Wildlife Management etc., and propose substantial funds from CAMPA for these activities. As these activities are not part of their State specific APOs of respective CSS of the Ministry, Forest Fire Management Scheme (FFMS) or Wildlife Management Plans and hence it becomes difficult for the Ministry to know as to how much money is being allocated to these items. The activities must be part of Integrated Management Plans or perspective plans and clearly indicate how much funding support is available from CSSs of Ministry and other sources including State Funds to avoid duplication and ensuring dovetailing funds for greater effectiveness.
- iii. The Chairman emphasized that the States/UTs, instead of following ad-hoc and tentative approach, should make perspective plan for utilizing NPV funds for at least 5 years so that identified and discernible outcomes can be achieved and qualitative and quantitative improvement in forests and tree cover including enrichment of biodiversity is achieved.
- iv. It has been observed in many instances that funds sanctioned and approved by National Authority are not being released by many State Governments in a timely manner, which is adversely affecting implementation of Compensatory Afforestation and other CAMPA activities making it impossible to properly utilise the approved funds. The

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- Executive Committee took a serious note of the matter and asked the National Authority to communicate to State Governments for the early resolution of the issue.
 - v. Soil and Moisture Conservation works should be carried out in an integrated manner from ridge to valley approach in degraded forests. This shall focus on rejuvenation of rivers and achievements should be placed as per the DPRs for 13 major rivers released by MoEFCC recently. APOs in future should indicate the reference of DPRs being implemented.
- vi. The State /UTs Authorities should make a detail record and status report of all the lands of protected areas/ forests under transmission lines and also natural regenerations and submit the status of their management to MoEF&CC.
- vii. The Chairperson highlighted important role and mandate of IRO in monitoring of CAMPA activities. He asked States/ UTs to involve concerned IRO at the APO planning Stage and thereafter in monitoring of activities. Though, Head of IRO is a member of Steering Committee, but it is observed that the APOs are not shared with them in advance for better appraisal. In future, the APOs should be submitted to concerned IRO at least one week before the meeting of State Steering Committee.
- All IROs were asked to take necessary action for inspection of CAMPA activities carried out in last 3 years. States/ UTs were asked to provide progress report and monitoring reports of internal as well as third party monitoring to IRO concerned along with all necessary support to Head of IRO and their officers for carrying out field inspections of CAMPA activities. As IRO and FSI are important stakeholders in the monitoring process, every state should make suitable provisions for budgetary support to them under monitoring head. Specific direction given are as below:
 - a. DGF&SS directed IRO, Chhattisgarh to submit inspection report on lantana eradication within 15 days time with respect to Chhattisgarh State.
 - b. DGF&SS asked IRO, Karnataka to submit the inspection report to ROHQ division about implementation of CAMPA activities being carried out by State Authorities.
 - c. DGF&SS sought comments from IRO Chennai about third party monitoring and internal reports of Tamil Nadu CAMPA works.
 - d. DGF& SS directed IROs for submitting the suggestions/comments on the APOs of respective States/UTs examine the monitoring and evaluation reports of both internal and external reports of CAMPA works done.

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- viii. DGF&SS directed State Forest Departments to complete the demarcation and digitization of forest boundaries for protection of forests and plantation activities within six months.
 - ix. DGF&SS directed State Authorities that the senior forest officers must adopt a patch of MDF/open forest/Scrub Forest land (about 10 to 25 ha.) for supervision of tree plantation and its maintenance for developing them as model plantations as desired by HMEF&CC. Officers must share all the details of the adapted land to the nodal officer of the Ministry (IGF, NAEB).
 - x. CEO, National Authority invited attention of all PCCFs and State CEOs CAMPA that the CA Funds are an additional fund and not a substitute of State or any other funds meant for afforestation, forest protection, management or infrastructure development. CAMPA Funds must be utilised for undertaking compensatory afforestation primarily for undertaking (both artificial and assisted natural regeneration) to compensate the loss of forest and ecosystem services on account of diverted forest land for non-forest activities. The primary aim should be to create more forests and improve quality of existing forests and the wildlife habitat through augmentation of fodder and water for wildlife.
 - Inviting attention of the State CEOs to the provisions of CAF Rules, 2016 and towards xi. the decision taken in earlier meetings, CEO NA reiterated that as a principle at least 80 per cent of the CAMPA funds should be utilized for the purpose of afforestation and forest regeneration and only up to a maximum of 20% be used for essential infrastructure support and capacity building that has direct impact on extension and improvement of forest cover and wildlife habitat. Further, not less than 60% of interest accrued on the deposits in State Funds should be spent on the activities for the conservation of forests and wildlife. For improvement of wildlife habitat, CAMPA fund should be utilized only for raising of fodder and fruit bearing trees, soil and moisture conservation, augmentation measures and invasive weed control. Fencing and constructions of essential protection infrastructure if required, in exceptional circumstances may be done under CAMPA fund by using locally available eco-friendly materials and only after assessing site specific requirements. He also stressed that as FSI and IROs are also involved in monitoring activities, ample budgetary provisions should be kept for them in the APOs under monitoring head. It is requested that IRO should submit the Monitoring and Evaluation reports to National Authority within three to four months.

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- xii. DGF & SS directed that construction and maintenance of Rescue Centre should only be taken up after vetting of Central Zoo Authority and if funds are not available from other sources.
- xiii. CEO, National Authority stressed the need of efficient use of NPV funds. Levy of NPV aims for compensating loss of ecological services and environmental values from diversion of forests and it should therefore be utilized systematically and judiciously in activities for restoring forest landscapes and to improve quality of forest cover, enhance biodiversity richness, strengthen, and optimize hydrological and other ecosystem functions.
- xiv. Further CEO, National Authority emphasized that afforestation, soil and water conservation measures and improvement of wildlife habitat should be taken up on priority in the areas adjacent to diverted forest lands for compensating the loss of forest cover and ecological services.
- xv. All the records of CAMPA activities including amount sanctioned and expenditure incurred should be maintained by concerned State CAMPA since its inception. The records should be properly maintained with Range, Division office and CEO State CAMPA in prescribed formats and placed on their websites.
- xvi. The annual accounts of CAMPA should be timely finalized and necessary action should be taken for early audit in time bound manner. Annual Reports are required to be laid in the Assembly, information on these the Annual reports laid in the Assembly may please be furnished to National Authority.
- xvii. A website of the State CAMPA should be properly developed, if not done earlier. It should have all relevant data, information, plantation maps, kml files of other assets and photographs of various activities carried out under CAMPA. In respect of CA, plantations/ regeneration activities before and after photographs should be uploaded.
- xviii. The kml files of all activities under CAMPA should be properly verified by the concerned Divisional Forest Officer and the certificates should be uploaded on the website.
 - xix. While submitting APOs, CEO State CAMPA concerned should certify that all estimates have been prepared on the basis of cost estimates followed for realizing CA, NPV and other levies from the User Agencies.
 - xx. The CEO, State/ UT CAMPA must certify that estimates for mandatory activities are based on provisions made in the CA funds received from the User Agency.

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- National Authority to prepare standard format for tender document on Monitoring and Evaluation after compilation of scheduled rates of respective state authorities and it should be activities-wise. Further, it was reiterated that for preparation of the sampling design and rates, IIFM procedure may be followed and timeline will be 3 weeks.
- The DGF&SS directed CEO, National Authority to coordinate with States/ UTs for carrying out work studies for development of model framework for Monitoring and Evaluation of various CAMPA activities (Desert areas, Wildlife Management, Coastal and Island Management, Wetland Management, Nursery development and Management, Saline soils plantations and Management, Soil and Water Conservation, Artificial regeneration, Assisted Natural Regeneration, Weed Removal, Linear plantation, fire Management, River rejuvenation etc.,) with sampling area of minimum 2 ha. at about 5 sites for each activity and for finalization of states for above study. CEO, National Authority may decide the selection of States based on CAMPA activity. The study will be carried out by National Authority.

PART B- APPROVAL OF ANNUAL PLANS OF OPERATIONS 2022-2023

6. AGENDA ITEMS NO: 3 TO 16 AND 37 TO 41

Decision: The Executive Committee discussed APOs for the FY 2022-2023 from 19 State/UT Authorities (Tripura, Chhattisgarh, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Madhya Pradesh, Manipur, Odisha, Andhra Pradesh, Kerala, West Bengal, Jharkhand, Jammu & Kashmir, Gujarat, Chandigarh, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Delhi, Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh) in detail and approved activities under CAF 2018 rules. The approved activities of APOs and their details States/UTs-wise in the 16th EC meeting are annexed at **Annexure B** (i to xix).

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PART C- APPROVAL/ DECISION ON SCHEMES AND OTHER ITEMS SEEKING FINANCIAL SUPPORT FROM NATIONAL FUND OF CAMPA

Agenda Item No. 17: "Assessment of population Status of Tigers, Co-predators, prey and their habitat in India (2021-23)" submitted by National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA).

Decision: The Executive Committee deliberated on the details furnished in the agenda items proposed by NTCA, MoEFCC at an estimated cost of Rs. 2159.73 lakh under section 15(1)(ii) of CAF Act, 2016. The aim of the project of All India Tiger Estimation (AITE) by the National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA), Wildlife Institute of India (WII) and 18 Tiger Range States (TRS) intends to monitor the status of tigers at pan India level. The assessment of three components namely; 1) Assessment of population status at pan India level, 2) the development of technological component M-STrIPES for data collection, analysis and visualization and 3) Technical support, capacity building of Tiger Range States for implementation of AITE, M-STrIPES, data collection, data analysis and preparation of technical reports.

The EC recommended the proposal for approval of the Governing Body of the National Authority as per provisions contained in sub-section 14(1)(iv) of CAF Act, 2016 subject to condition that monitoring the implementation and progress shall be the responsibility of NTCA.

Agenda Item No. 18: "Implementation of Management Effectiveness Evaluation (MEE) of the Tiger Reserves" submitted by National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA)

Decision: The Executive Committee considered the proposal submitted by NTCA, MoEFCC at an estimated cost of Rs.152.06 lakhs under section 15(1)(ii) of CAF Act, 2016. The project aims at to evaluate Tiger Reserves in the country, which is an essential approach for tiger conservation and management along with the associated landscape. The project proposal is proposed by the National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) and also involves Wildlife Institute of India (WII) and 18 Tiger Range States (TRS) in the assessment.

The EC recommended the proposal for approval of the Governing Body of the National Authority as per provisions contained in sub-section 14(1)(iv) of CAF Act, 2016 subject to condition that monitoring the implementation and progress shall be the responsibility of NTCA.

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Agenda Item No. 19: Hiring of Office Space for National Authority.

Decision: CEO CAMPA informed the EC that the normal functioning of National Authority is badly affected due to paucity of office space. In absence of suitable office space, the National Authority is finding difficulty in engaging sanctioned manpower to discharge its normal functioning effectively. Accordingly, after intensive search of office space available with various agencies viz. NBCC, CPWD, DMRC, MTNL, NDMC and other PSUs, for hiring of office space for National Authority about 9,300 sq ft space in the SCOPE Complex with Cement Corporation of India has been found most suitable and selected. IFD has concurred the proposal for hiring the space on rental basis of about @ Rs 36 lakh per month with 5% annual increase. Copy of such approval is attached with these minutes.

Further, this office space is open hall shape raw structure and requires suitable refurbishing for which NBCC has been requested to give estimates for development. NBCC has given an estimated cost of Rs. 4.00 crore as one time expenditure. The work will be undertaken after concurrence of IFD. An additional fund of about Rs. 1.0 crore will be required for office equipment and IT infrastructure. Necessary approvals will be obtained.

The EC noted the proposal.

Agenda Item No. 20: Engagement of Manpower in the National Authority

Decision: The Governing Body in its meeting held in 2019 has already approved essential manpower for National Authority office. After detail deliberations on the proposal of engagement of manpower in the National Authority submitted by CEO, National Authority, the Executive Committee agreed in principle to the proposal of the National Authority as mentioned in the agenda item.

The EC decided that the appropriate proposal may be moved to IFD for concurrence before obtaining approval of competent authorities.

Agenda item No. 21: Establishment of Programme Management Unit (PMU) and National Monitoring and Evaluation Cell (NMEC) for National Authority

Decision: The Executive Committee discussed the proposal for setting up of Programme Management Unit for supporting National Authority of CAMPA in appraisal of APOs, processing of Financial & Accounting matters, and coordination on monitoring etc for carrying

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out the functions as per requirements of the CAF Act, 2016. The CEO, National Authority, CAMPA informed the Executive Committee that a multi-skilled professional team in the form of Programme Management Unit is necessary for effective management of programmes and activities being planned and implemented under CAMPA to support National Authority. The PMU will enhance capacity and capability of CEO office in effective discharge of its function as mandated in the CAF Act, 2016. Programme Management Unit once deployed through outsourcing will fill critical gaps in functioning and functions of the office of National Authority immediately.

The Executive Committee after detailed deliberations agreed to the proposal of the Programme Management Unit in the National Authority as mentioned in the agenda item and informed that the proposal may be moved to IFD for their concurrence.

Joint CEO, CAMPA made a presentation on National Monitoring and Evaluation Centre (NMEC) and proposed to be set up it in National Authority. The NMEC will seek support from FSI, IIFM, ICFRE institutions in India and WII for monitoring of CAMPA activities systematically. IIFM will be requested to provide back up support in carrying out monitoring and evaluation with technical support from FSI.

The Executive Committee agreed to the proposal of National Monitoring and Evaluation Centre (NMEC) and recommended for seeking approval of Governing Body.

Agenda Item No. 22: 'No cost extension' of the scheme "NCAC-WII Dehradun proposal-funding of Operationalizing the UNESCO Category 2 Centre-World Natural Heritage Management & Training for Asia-Pacific Region" submitted by the WII, Dehradun.

Decision: UNESCO C2C is an ongoing scheme initially approved by the National CAMPA Advisory Council (NCAC) with a total financial outlay of Rs. 18.66 crore for a period of 6 years from 2013-14 to 2018-19. The Governing Body of National Authority in its 1st meeting held on 5th November, 2019 approved extension of schemes for another three years from 2019-2022 with 'no cost extension. This scheme was initiated as a commitment in the agreement between Govt. of India and UNESCO which is valid up to 2024.

The Executive Committee of the National Authority after noting that one time extension for three years has already been granted till 2022, directed WII, the Project Implementation Agency to furnish details of the project deliverables and the progress made so far on each



deliverables, the reasons for the delay giving full justification for the need of extension of scheme beyond its scheduled completion date for another two years i.e. 2022-2024 and the Programme Division of the Ministry. The Executive Committee further directed that on receipt of the detailed progress report, an assessment of the same should be undertaken by the National Authority to see how far the programme objectives have been achieved and if any corrective measures are required or not.

Agenda Item No. 23: 'No cost extension' of the scheme "National Programme for Conservation and Development of Forest Genetic Resources: Pilot Project on Creation of Centre of Excellence of Forest Genetic Resource (CoFGR)" submitted by the Forest Research Institute (FRI), Dehradun.

Decision: The National Programme for Conservation and Development of Forest Genetic Resources: Pilot Project on Creation of Centre of Excellence of Forest Genetic Resource (CoFGR) is ongoing scheme being implemented by FRI at a total financial implication of the scheme was Rs.8.61Crores for a period of 5 years (2016-17 to 2020-21). 'No cost extension' of the scheme till 31.3.2022 has been approved in the 9th meeting of the Executive Committee of the National Authority held on 12th January, 2021.

The Executive Committee has approved three months' extension (i.e. till 30th June, 2022) of the scheme for writing and printing the PCR without any additional budget. The Executive Committee has directed to submit the detail deliverables and progress report till date to the National Authority and to make a presentation. Further EC directed that the evaluation of the project should be undertaken by National Authority.

Agenda Item No. 24: Project Proposal "Ecosystem Reconstruction by Interventions in terms of Phytosociological Characteristics and Indicator Biodiversity Components along Development sites in the Sikkim Himalaya: A pilot study with a total outlay of Rs. 1.57 Crores for a period of 3 years- submitted by Registrar, Sikkim University.

Decision: The proposal was not considered as the project proposal has not been routed through State CAMPA of Sikkim State.

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Agenda Item No. 25: Project Proposal for "Development of Sandalwood and Rosewood Estates and Management of Sandalwood Reserves in Karnataka" with a total outlay of Rs. 25.65 crore for a period of 7 years- submitted by Principal Chief Conservator of Forest, Karnataka Forest Department, Karnataka.

Decision: The Executive Committee deliberated the proposal submitted by PCCF, Karnataka Forest Department, at an estimated cost of Rs. 25.65 crore for a period of 7 years from National Fund of CAMPA under section 15(1)(ii) of CAF Act, 2016. Research and Territorial wings of Karnataka Forest Department will be the implementing agency in technical consultation with Institute of Wood Science and Technology (IWST), Bengaluru.

The major objectives of the project are:

- Identification and selection of superior genotypes of Sandalwood and Rosewood.
- Collection and supply/distribution of seeds and other planting material from different provenances.
- Raising Quality Planting Material (QPM) for departmental use and distribution to farmers.
- Establishing Multi Location Trial (MLT) plots in its natural distributional range as well as different agro-climatic zones of Karnataka.
- Maintenance of Multi Location Trial plots of Santalum album and Dalbergia latifolia under different Agro-Climatic zones.
- Conducting studies on Protection of Sandalwood Plantations through Technological interventions like RFID, use of Web-enabled CC Cameras, Electronic-eye (e-eye) technology and other technologies for protecting Sandalwood plantations.
- Study of Market dynamics and Providing Market linkages for Santalum album and Dalbergia latifolia grown by farmers.
- Management of Sandalwood Reserves (Estates) in different Divisions of Karnataka.
- Capacity Building and Training of Farmers regarding Legal issues, Development,
 Management, protection, Marketing, subsidies and other Technologies etc. and
 encouraging/motivating farmers to take up plantations of Santalum album and
 Dalbergia latifolia.

After detailed deliberations, EC noted that the objectives of the proposal are quite useful for promotion of Tree outside Forests (TOF), besides assisting in conservation of rare, endangered and threatened tree species. The EC recommended the proposal for approval of the Governing

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Body of the National Authority as per provisions contained in sub-section 14(1)(iv) of CAF Act, 2016.

Agenda Item No. 26: Project Proposal for "Rehabilitation of Jhum Land in state of Arunachal Pradesh." with a total outlay of Rs. 65.32 Crores for a period of 5 years- submitted by Department of Environment & Forests, Government of Arunachal Pradesh.

Decision: The proposal was discussed in detail and not approved.

Agenda Item No. 27: Project Proposal for "Proposal for Watershed Development cum Soil Conservation." with a total outlay of Rs. 516.68 Crores for a period of 5 years-submitted by Additional Development Commissioner, Government of Meghalaya.

Decision: The proposal taken up for detailed discussion and not approved.

Agenda Item No. 28: Project Proposal for "Proposal for Rain Museum at Sohra, Meghalaya." with a total outlay of Rs. 119.00 Crores- submitted by Additional Development Commissioner, Government of Meghalaya.

Decision: The proposal was deliberated in details and not approved.

Agenda Item No. 29: Project Proposal on Centre of Excellence for Community Reserves at Dimapur" with a total outlay of Rs. 19.02 crore for a period of 3 years submitted by the Department of Environment, Forests & Climate Change, Government of Nagaland through Office of the Wildlife Division, MoEF&CC.

Decision: The proposal was deliberated in details and not approved.

Agenda Item No. 30: Project Proposal on up gradation and funding of Future Research activities of Karnataka" with a total outlay of Rs.171.00 Crores for a period of 5 years submitted by the Additional Chief Secretory, Department of Forest, Ecology & Environment Govt. of Karnataka.

Decision: The proposal was discussed in detail and not approved.

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Agenda Item No. 31: Voluntary Village relocation from Tadoba-Andhari Tiger Reserve, Maharashtra State Authority.

Decision: Based on the recommendation of NTCA, EC approved the proposal subject to following relevant Rules and Regulations.

Agenda Item No. 32: The proposal for Revamping of existing e-GreenWatch Portal and Maintenance of E-Green watch submitted by Deputy Director General, Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology (NIC) with total outlay of Rs.14,66.172/-

Decision: The proposal was discussed and not approved. It was recommended that as new Parivesh portal is to launched with CAMPA funds, CAMPA activities should be part of Parivesh project.

Agenda Item No. 33: Proposal for Watershed Development work using LiDAR technique submitted by State Authority of Chhattisgarh.

Decision: The proposal was not approved from the National Fund. State was asked to implement activities through State CAMPA based on local scheduled rates of activities approved by competent authority of state.

Agenda Item No.34: Implementation of Project on preparation of DPR with LiDAR Survey for one Pilot Watershed in forest Area of each State/UT. A presentation was made by Director, WAPCOS before the Executive Committee and States/UTs officials present. The Director WAPCOS informed that they have completed the project in 25 States & UTs but could not take up the LiDAR survey in Jammu & Kashmir due to not getting the permission to fly the aircraft. He also mentioned that the area for survey has exceeded the initial target, on which Executive Committee was of the view that the decision should be taken by the Programme Division as per terms and conditions of the Agreement for the project.

The State/UT representatives were asked about their comments on the LiDAR Project. Most of the States/UTs expressed satisfaction with the outcome of the project. WAPCOS was asked to provide copies of DPR along with all relevant data to the National Authority and concerned State/UT Forest Departments.

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Decision: The Executive Committee deliberated the details of the project and expressed satisfaction over the use of LiDAR technology in preparation of DPR for Soil and Moisture improvement inside forest catchment areas. Further, EC asked WAPCOS to address the concern of the States/UTs and finalise the DPR in consultation with the States/UTs and submit to Project Division. Project Division was directed to present complete details in the next EC meeting to finalise the LiDAR project.

Agenda Item. No.35: Implementation and Streamlining of Nagar Van Yojana (NVY) and School Nursery Yojana (SNY).

Decision: The Proposal was approved without engagement of any consultant and without extra expenditure for monitoring. Monitoring and Evaluation should be done by State CAMPA from its own provision of monitoring under CAMPA funds approved in APO by National Authority.

Agenda Item No. 42: Project proposal for the yearly maintenance, Up-gradation and FC module and hand holding support of PARIVESH portal.

Decision: As the project proposal is already under implementation, the EC approved for its continuation. The EC observed that office support staff of National Authority may also be engaged through NICSI after proper assessment.
